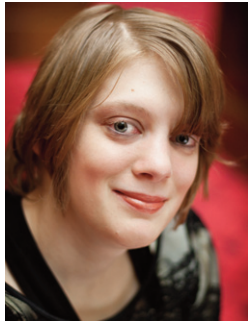

**The Hon Kelly Vincent MLC** was elected into South Australia's Legislative Council in March 2010 running as part of the Dignity for Disability Party. At 21yo, she is Australia's youngest female Parliamentarian, and is also the first in a South Australian Parliament to use a wheelchair for mobility.

Kelly is a strong supporter of radical change in the way the needs of people with disabilities are met, and believes that the Australian Productivity Commission's Review into Disability, and the adoption of an NDIS style of funding model could be a breakthrough for our country. Kelly and Dignity for Disability believe in Dignity Through Choice.



**The Hon Bill Shorten** was elected as the Labor member for Maribyrnong on November 24, 2007 and was immediately appointed Parliamentary Secretary for Disabilities and Children's Services.

Bill has been a strong advocate for the rights of people with disability and for improving services and employment opportunities for them. He is involved in the development of the Federal Government's National Disability Strategy and the National Mental Health and Disability Employment Strategy.



**Bruce Bonyhady** is Chairman of Yooralla, Victoria's largest disability services provider, President of Philanthropy Australia and Chairman of Acadian Asset Management Australia Limited.

In April 2008 he co-authored a submission to the 2020 Summit recommending a National Disability Insurance Scheme.

In 2008 and 2009 he was a Member of the Disability Investment Group and is now a Member of the Independent Panel advising the Productivity Commission Inquiry into a Disability Care and Support Scheme.



**The Hon Mitch Fifield** has represented Victoria in the Australian Senate since 2004 and serves as the Shadow Parliamentary Secretary for Disabilities, Carers and the Voluntary Sector. He also holds the position of Deputy Manager of Opposition Business in the Senate.

Mitch is an Ambassador for The Song Room, a school music organisation, and an advisory board member of the Yachad Accelerated Learning Project for indigenous students.
